The story in this week's lesson "The Lord of the Sabbath" is from the book of Matthew. Keeping the Sabbath was a very big deal for the Jewish religious community during Bible times. Observing the Sabbath was taken so seriously that the Jews had constructed a series of laws that, if kept, would ensure that someone could not accidentally break the Sabbath command. The opening verses of Matthew 12 shine light on the contention the religious leaders had with Jesus over the Sabbath. Enjoy this week's story!

Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers.


Text Truth: People are precious to God, so God is honored when we do what is good for others.

ENJOY THIS WEEK'S STORY!

One Sabbath day Jesus and His disciples were walking through fields of grain. The disciples were hungry, so they started to pick and eat some of the grain. When the Pharisees saw the disciples, they said to Jesus, "Do You see what Your disciples are doing? They are breaking the law for the Sabbath day."

Jesus told the religious leaders, "Haven't you read what David did when he and the men traveling with him were hungry? David entered the tabernacle and ate the bread of the Presence, which only the priest was allowed to do. Haven't you read in the law that on the Sabbath day the priests in the temple work but are innocent?"

Then Jesus said, "If you understood what 'I desire mercy not sacrifice' meant, you would not have judged those who are innocent. The Son of Man is the Lord of the Sabbath."

Jesus reminded the religious leaders that God did not consider David's actions sinful, and God did not consider the priests who had to work in the temple on the Sabbath as breaking the law. The Sabbath was not broken when people were in need or worshiping or being kind to others.

After Jesus spoke to the religious leaders, He entered the synagogue. Jesus saw a man who had a shriveled hand. The leaders wanted to accuse Jesus of sinning and breaking the law, so they asked, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath?"

Jesus answered, "If your sheep fell into a pit, wouldn't you lift it out? A person is worth more than a sheep. It is lawful to do good on the Sabbath."

Then Jesus looked at the man and said.

"Stretch out your hand." When the man stretched out his hand, it was



healed. But the religious leaders began to plan how they could kill Jesus.

Jesus knew what the religious leaders were doing, so He went to find a quiet spot. But the crowds of people followed Him. Jesus healed the people. He warned them not to tell others about Him so that Isaiah's prophecy about the Messiah would be fulfilled.

Isaiah promised that the Messiah would be God's Son. He would be loved and chosen by God. He would have the Spirit of God in Him, and He would rule over all nations as a humble and peaceful ruler. The Messiah would not only rescue the Israelites from their sin, but He would rescue the Gentiles as well.

Jesus taught that you could keep the Sabbath holy and do what is right and good to help others. People are precious to God, so God is honored when we do what is good for others. Jesus is the Messiah. He obeyed God and showed others that God loves and cares for them.

OPEN YOUR BIBLE TO THE BOOK OF MATTHEW

READ MATTHEW 12:8

 The Sabbath is a day of rest considered holy to God because He rested on the seventh day after creation. The Sabbath became a time for the Israelites to gather together and worship.

Remember our Text Truth: People are precious to God, so God is honored when we do what is good for others.

READ MATTHEW 12:12

 Religious leaders did not understand that the Sabbath day was not about a list of rules. The heart of the Sabbath was to honor God.
